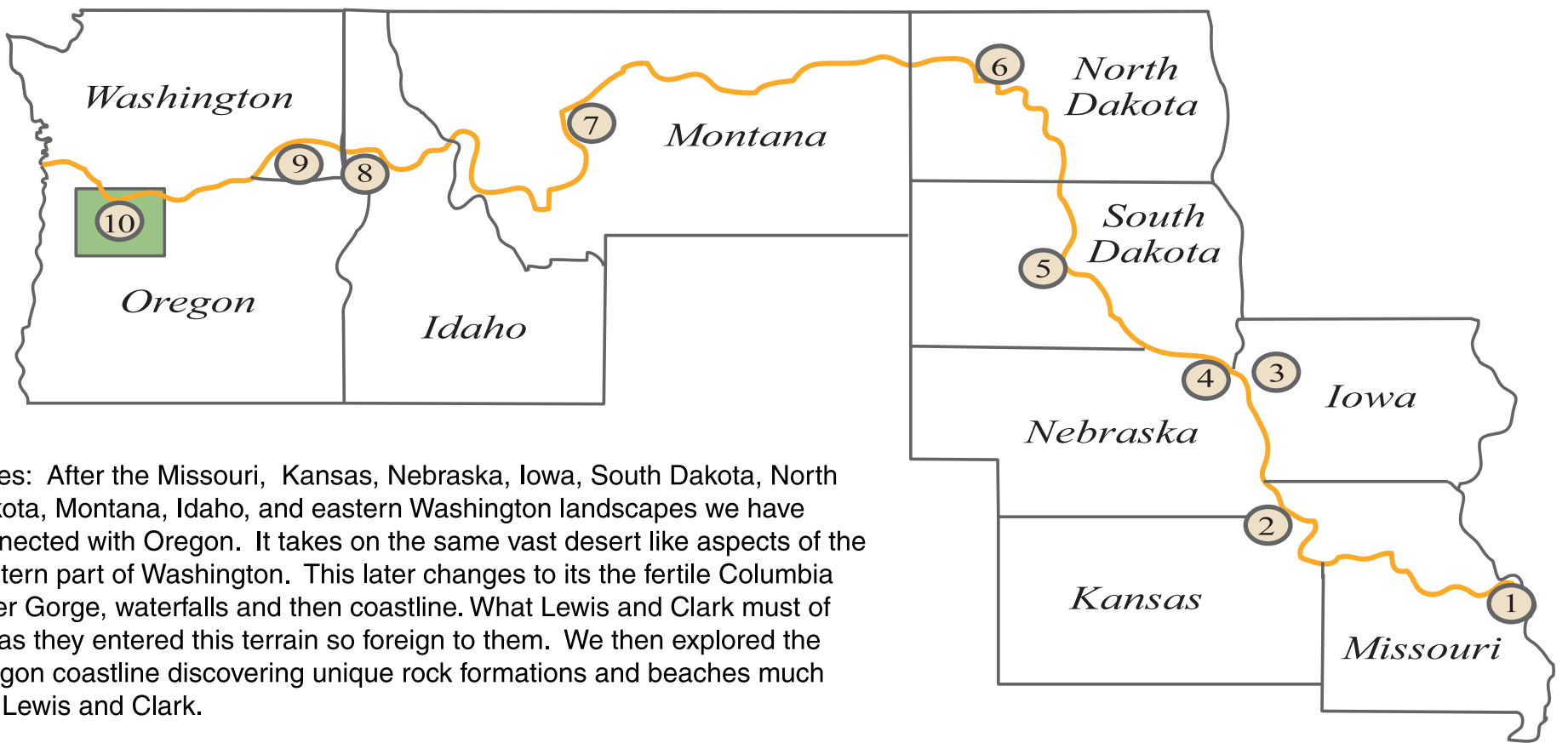
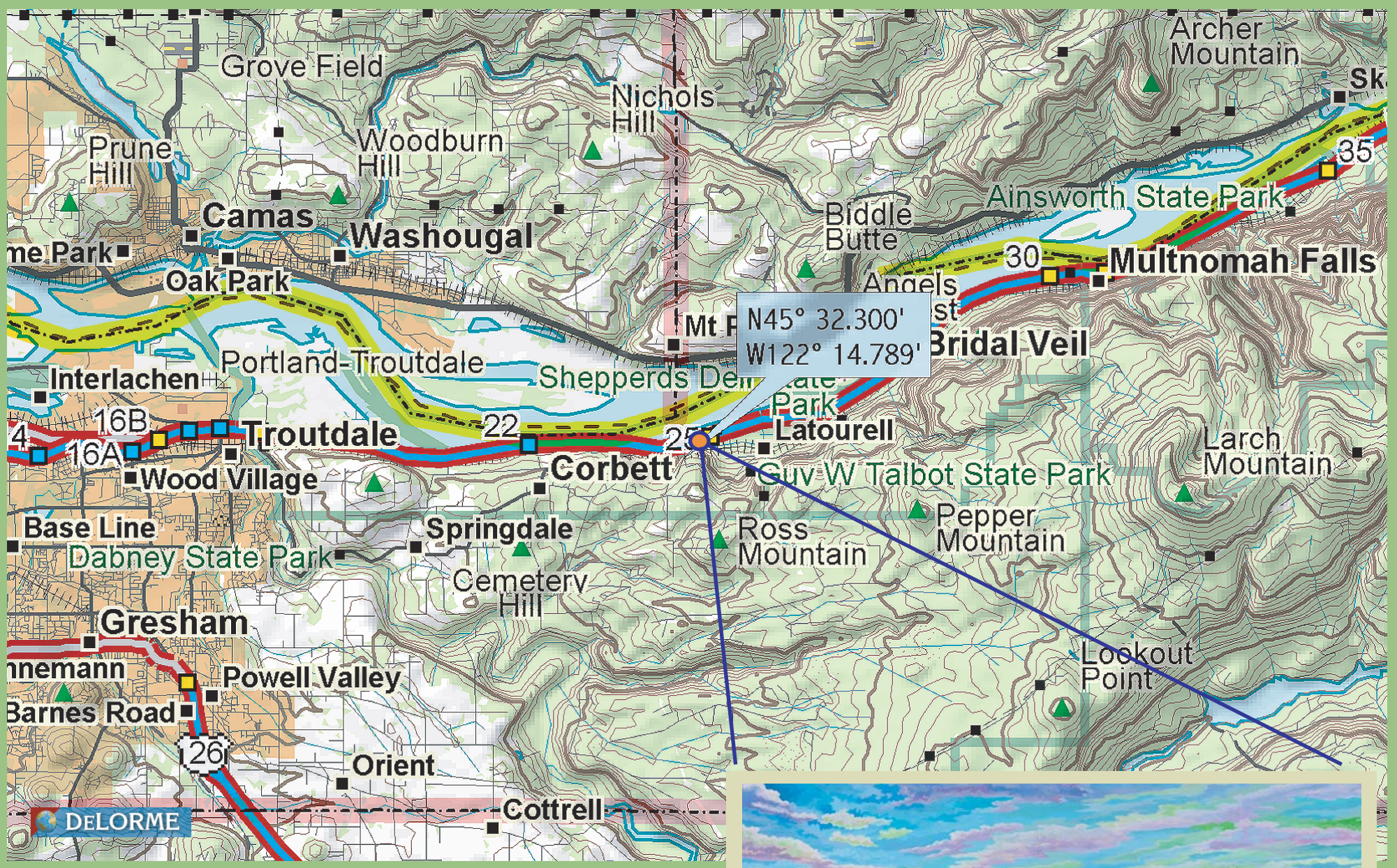


Discover America: Oregon



Notes: After the Missouri, Kansas, Nebraska, Iowa, South Dakota, North Dakota, Montana, Idaho, and eastern Washington landscapes we have connected with Oregon. It takes on the same vast desert like aspects of the Eastern part of Washington. This later changes to its the fertile Columbia River Gorge, waterfalls and then coastline. What Lewis and Clark must of felt as they entered this terrain so foreign to them. We then explored the Oregon coastline discovering unique rock formations and beaches much like Lewis and Clark.



Soon after the Snake River flows into the mighty Columbia River, Oregon joins on the South side of the river and co-hosts the Columbia River Gorge. This view is from Vista House atop a bluff that surveys the most fertile area along the entire route. With its dense vegetation, strong wind and the temperate influences of the Pacific Ocean, this area provides an enduring bounty. Lewis and Clark encountered an environment that they had never seen before and had to endure its abundant rainfall at Fort Clatsop.
