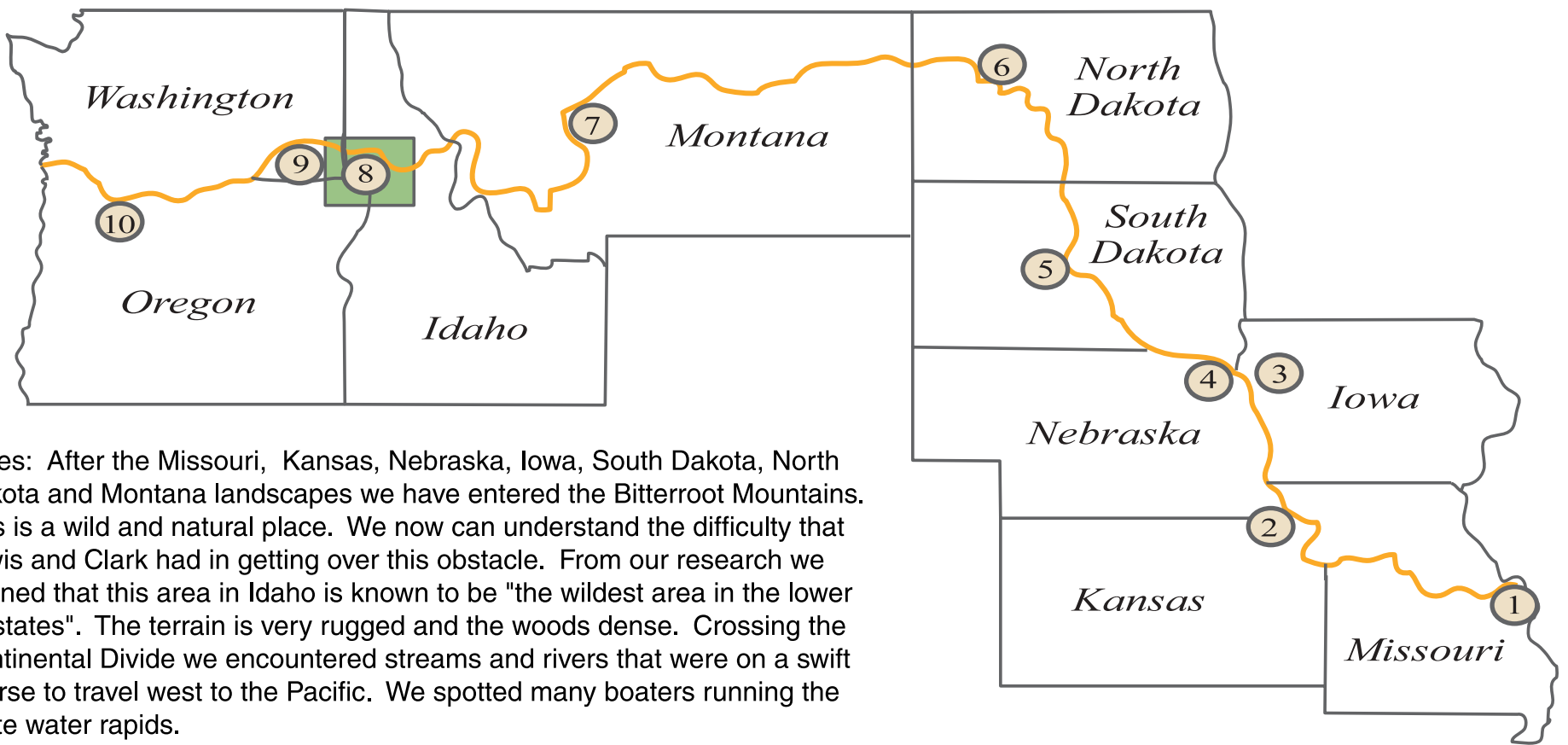
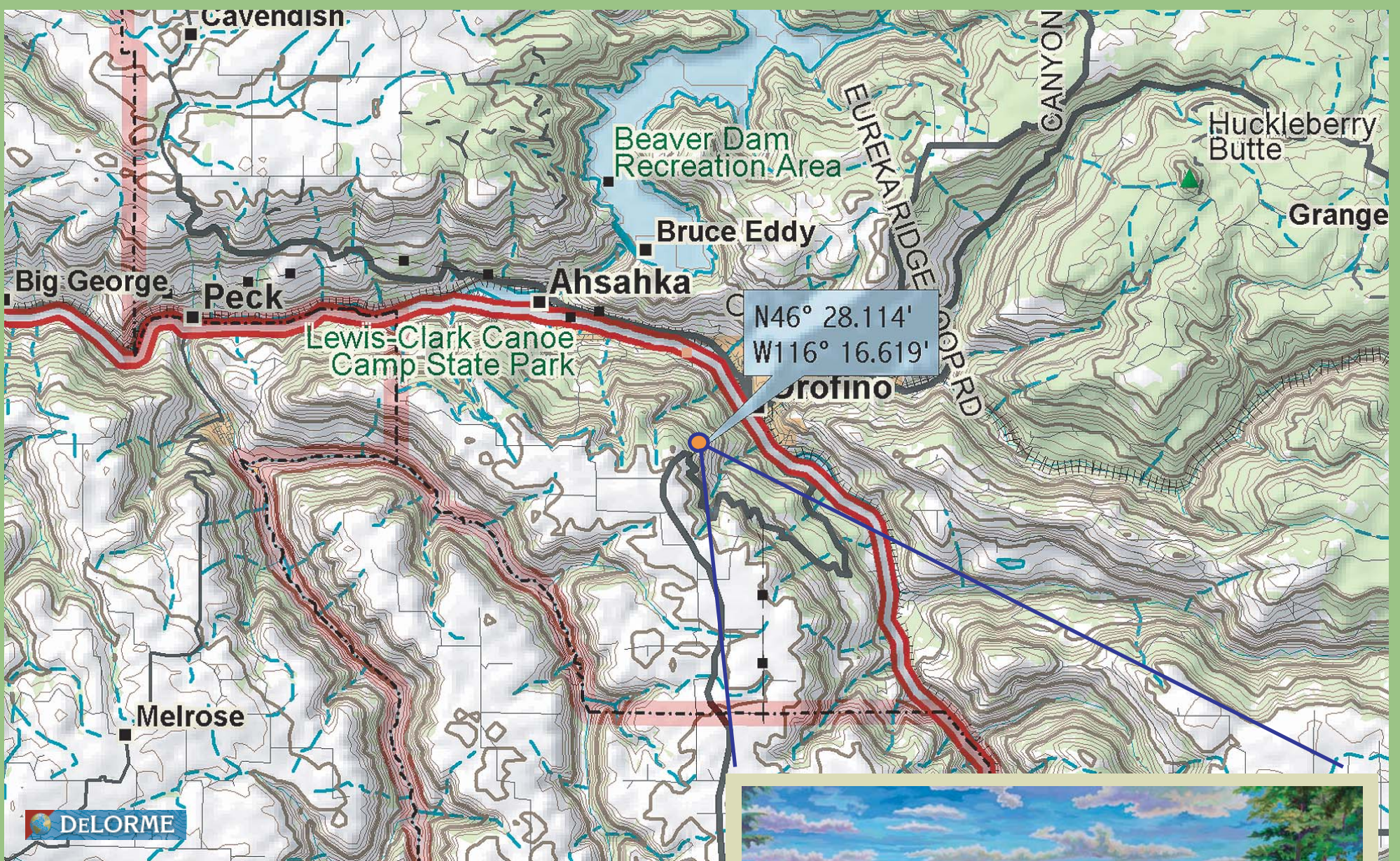


Discover America: Idaho
