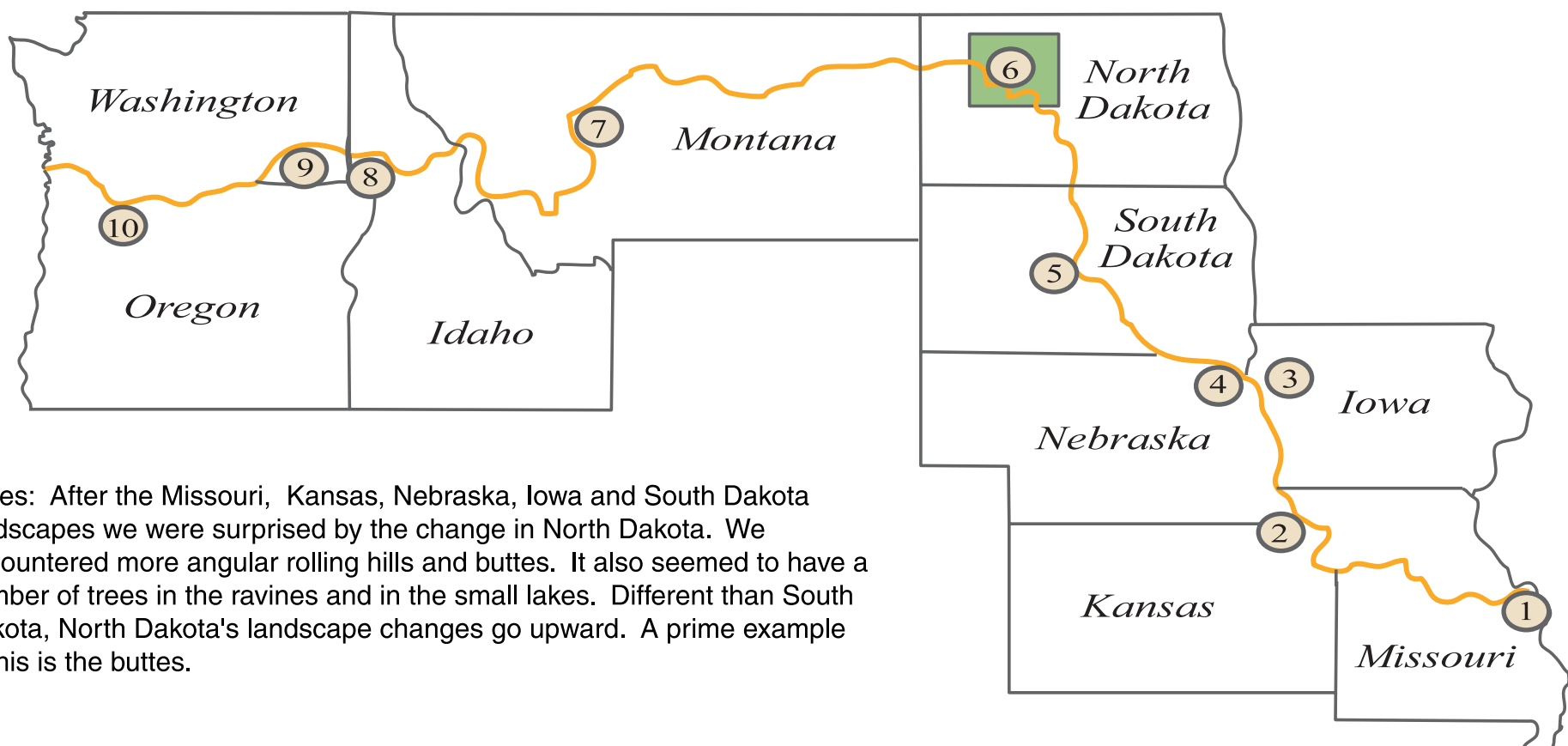
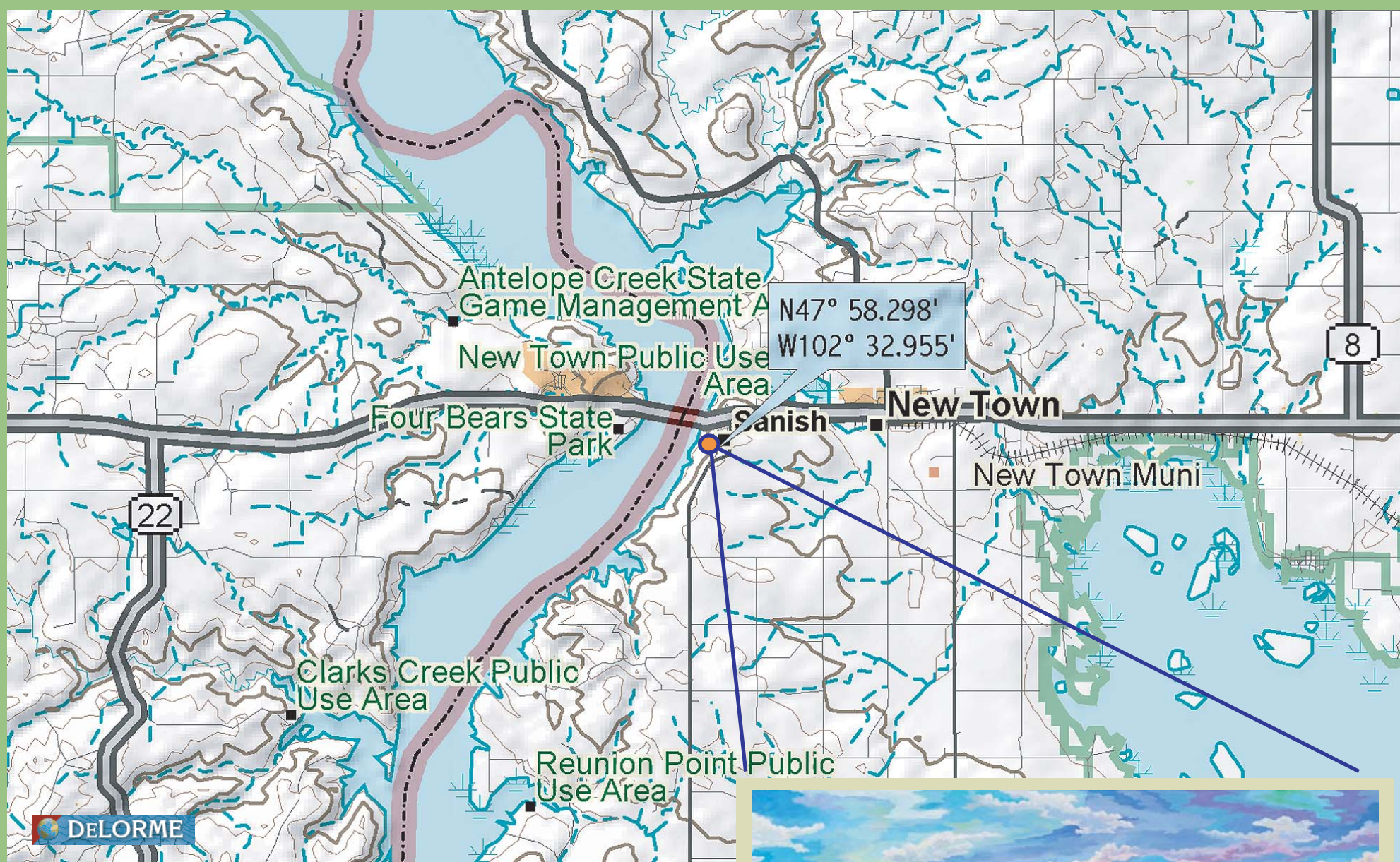


Discover America: North Dakota



Notes: After the Missouri, Kansas, Nebraska, Iowa and South Dakota landscapes we were surprised by the change in North Dakota. We encountered more angular rolling hills and buttes. It also seemed to have a number of trees in the ravines and in the small lakes. Different than South Dakota, North Dakota's landscape changes go upward. A prime example of this is the buttes.



The land seems to go to seed as the flat plain begins to push upward with buttes that dot the horizon. The depressions in the landscape become pockets of lush green rolling hills that hold a simple and steady rhythm to their shape. This view is just South of New Town looking across to the western buttes allowing points of navigation for all travelers through history.
