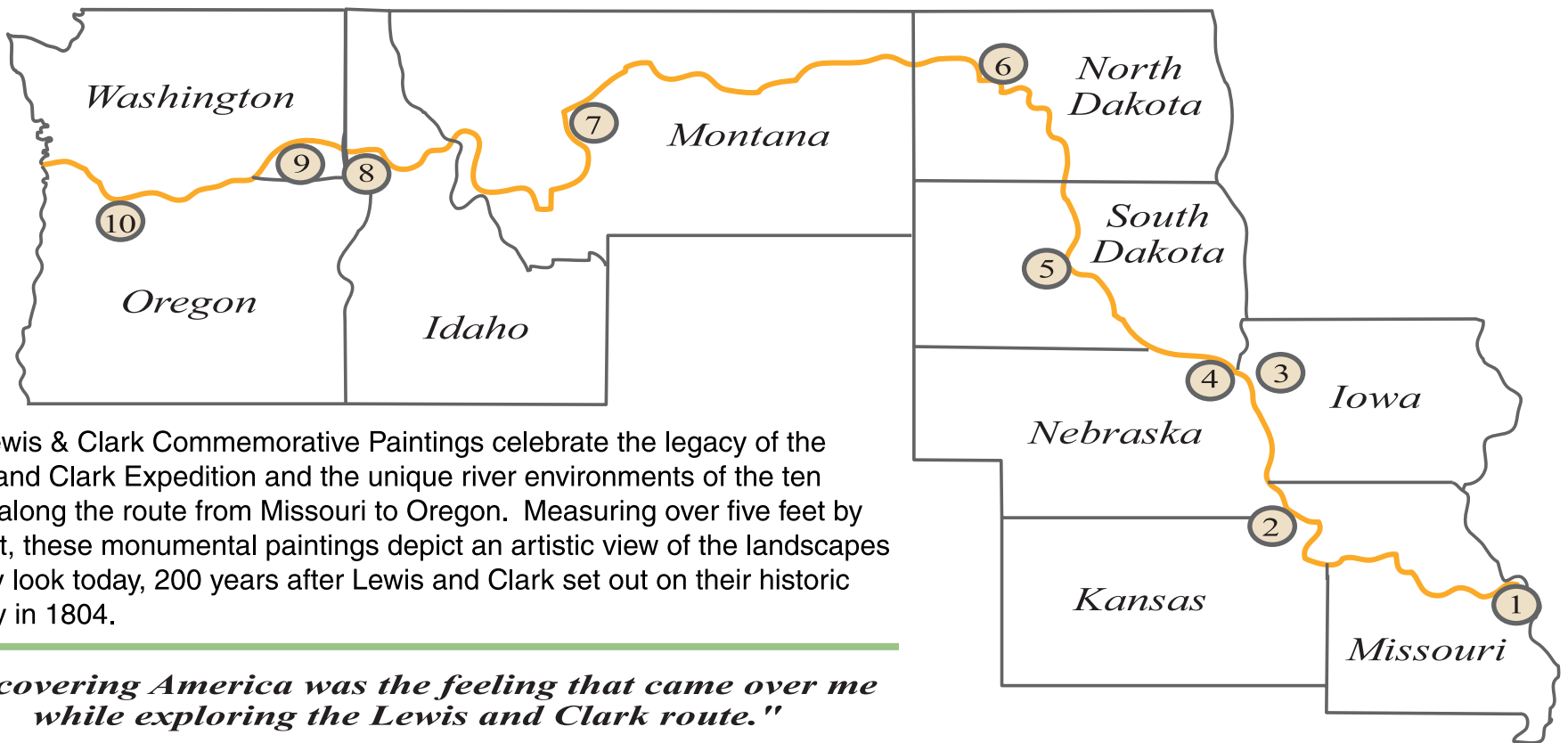


THE LEWIS AND CLARK COMMEMORATIVE PAINTINGS

The Lewis & Clark Commemorative Paintings celebrate the legacy of the Lewis and Clark Expedition and the unique river environments of the ten states along the route from Missouri to Oregon. Measuring over five feet by ten feet, these monumental paintings depict an artistic view of the landscapes as they look today, 200 years after Lewis and Clark set out on their historic journey in 1804.

Discovering America was the feeling that came over me while exploring the Lewis and Clark route.

"As we followed the trail, via small river roads and through small towns, I was overwhelmed by the environments along the route. Each day I was surprised by the immense changes in the way the land was sculpted and the range of vegetation in the environment. The landscape seem to unfold as one moves West

along the route. These new discoveries were a great inspiration and make a tremendous impact on the final paintings.

Each state was documented from the highest points along the river route using a specialized camera and a vehicle outfitted for rooftop photography. Over 9000 photographs

were taken resulting in one unique vista from each state that best represented its dynamic character in relation to the nine other states.
